Uzbeks have been a nation rich in wedding types since ancient times. Circumcision wedding, Marriage wedding, Hair wedding, Tooth wedding, Cradle wedding, First step wedding, Blessing wedding, Fifty, Sixty-three and over weddings, widely celebrates Ramadan and Eid al-Adha.

Although the wedding is a family holiday, it is shared with all relatives - clan, neighborhood - kuy, friends - brothers. It serves to educate people in qualities such as honesty, harmony, kindness, kindness, generosity, faith, hospitality, humanity, and friendship.

Wedding ceremonies of the Uzbek people are very beautiful, colorful in content, weddings held in each region have unique characteristics, pictures and styles. This shows how rich our people's spirituality, humanitarianism, love for beautiful life, hospitality, and tendency to cheerfulness are. In the olden days, weddings and parties were played with laughter, poetry, wrestling, kopkari, and rock climbing. Competitions of Bakhshis gave weddings an elegant and gentle mood. With this method, wedding ceremonies were held in an interesting, meaningful, fun, and joyful manner. At the same time, the national values of the people were promoted, polished, and passed on from generation to generation. In this regard, the spiritual culture of the people and the young generation has been shaped.

Rituals related to burying the dead and commemorating them are considered to be rituals and traditions that have been forming since ancient times. My God gave man a word, Don't do anything stupid, Good and bad are known from this, Do not pass in front of anyone.

We can see the superiority of the feeling of loving and honoring a person, which is unique to our people, through the manners and customs of greeting and asking about one's well-being.

In fact, the folk tradition is extremely rich in vital and popular customs, traditions, customs and traditions that the family, first of all, the parents, should follow from the birth of the child. A child's first hair and nails, teething, chicken pox, saying the first word, learning to sit, taking the first step, starting to wear clothes, the first acquaintance with the world of plants and animals , handing over to the tutor, many moral education, customs, customs and rituals related to the first step to school are among them. Nowruz holiday has not lost its magic and freshness until now, but has become a holiday that our people look forward to, and many of our traditions related to the holiday have been revived.

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"Sada" holiday was celebrated as the day of the discovery of fire in ancient times. After the introduction of Islam, this holiday disappeared, but some of its elements have survived to this day. For example, in some regions there is still a tradition of circling the bride around the fire.

Among the many ceremonies related to agriculture, "Shokhmoy" was celebrated with special joy and solemnity. The rituals associated with this holiday encouraged people to be united, kind and hardworking.

In these traditions and ceremonies, the elderly were honored, and our people learned to look to the future with hope and confidence.

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
